How do I apply?

You are qualified for consideration for all college scholarships as well as those at **Washington State University (WSU)** by completing the university scholarship application. In addition, your completed application will be sent to your major interest area within the college so that you will be considered for additional scholarships at that level, if available. All scholarship awards require admittance to **WSU** and those from the **College of Agricultural, Human, and Natural Resource Sciences (CAHNRS)** require study of a major from within this college.

How large are the scholarships? How many are awarded?

CAHNRS scholarship amounts range from \$100 to \$4,000. Awards from this college are made to more than 300 students each year.

What are the awards based on?

Criteria include grade point average, SAT, essay, and leadership. Some scholarships (see specific requirements) also consider financial need, major field of study, career goals, and affiliation with particular organizations or place of residency.

Dean's Merit Award is for incoming freshmen only, renewable for sophomores if they maintain a 3.4 GPA and take at least 12 credits per semester. For incoming freshmen, applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.6 or be in the top 10% of their graduating class. Finalists for this award are interviewed. Candidates who do not receive a Dean's Merit Award will automatically be forwarded to the general CAHNRS scholarship pool.

Departmental Scholarships do not require a separate application form. The WSU scholarship application will be forwarded to the departments for departmental scholarship awards.

University Scholarships require the Washington State University Application for Academic Scholarships. Awards include the Glenn Terrell Presidential, Lou and Ruth Allen, and many miscellaneous University scholarships.

Scholarships from outside sources require separate applications and are listed at the end of this document. They represent contributions from a variety of individuals and organizations who, like the CAHNRS, strive to support students pursuing degrees in agriculture, human development, and natural resource sciences.

More about the College

With fifteen teaching departments, 503 faculty, and more than 1,600 students, diversity is one of the key strengths of the college. The college offers more than 25 different majors and options, ranging from wildlife ecology to early childhood education, interior design, turf management, viticulture/enology, human nutrition, and landscape architecture, to name a few.

Consider some of these other benefits to students in the **CAHNRS** programs:

Renowned, caring faculty and staff

The College's people are its greatest asset. Faculty are world-known experts in areas such as international marketing and plant and animal sciences. You will work closely with a faculty advisor to help you plan your classes and prepare for your career.

High career placement

Nationally, a 10-15% shortage of college graduates in agriculture and human sciences is predicted. At WSU, many departments report 100% placement. You also have the support of an active internship network and career services office that brings 300 employers to campus.

Education with experience

Learning extends beyond the walls of the classroom to facilities including greenhouses, animal health and management centers, design studios, pre-schools, hospitals, and computer laboratories. Field trips may take you to New York's garment district, a winery, or a wildlife sanctuary.

Undergraduate research

You may apply for special grants to pursue areas of particular interest to you. For example, you may work with a faculty mentor scientist, and have the opportunity to taste "the excitement of discovery." Many of these research projects have been presented and awarded honors at national meetings.

Leadership development

The **College of Agricultural, Human, and Natural Resource Sciences** is concerned with the education of the whole person. More than 30 clubs in the college provide an arena for socialization, personal development, and professional networking. Activities include academic quiz bowls, livestock and dairy judging contests, fashion shows, plant sales, and food and clothing drives.

Global perspective

You will have opportunities for international exchanges with several countries. Australia, Italy, France, Mexico, New Zealand, former Soviet Union countries, and Denmark have been recent popular destinations for students.

Students take a wide variety of agricultural and non-agricultural courses, receiving in-depth training in the biology of farm animals. The curriculum is designed to provide students with scientific, practical, and people skills. Options for program specialization include: 1) Industry Option which is recommended for students preparing to work in agricultural production or agribusiness, 2) Production Management Option emphasizes the business aspects of animal agriculture, 3) Science Option places emphasis on basic science and is recommended for students planning to attend graduate school, work in an area of science or technology, or apply to the professional program leading to the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine.

The Department of Community and Rural Sociology offers courses and a minor in the area of Community Studies. These are designed to help students increase their knowledge of how community based social structures influence human behavior, how and why community development efforts succeed or fail, how the globalization of the world's economic, political, and social systems are affecting the quality of life in communities world wide, and how community conflicts may be resolved successfully. They are intended to help prepare student for effectively living and working in communities, and for working to influence community development and change. School of Economic Sciences

The School of Economic Sciences offers a degree in Economics, as well as degrees in Agribusiness, Agricultural Economics and Management, Environmental and Economics and Management, and Economics. Economics is the study of the allocation of resources between competing and alternative uses. All of the degree options include the study of Macroeconomics, which analyzes the level of output and prices, inflation, and unemployment in the economy, and Microeconomics, which emphasizes how consumers make purchase decisions and how they use their time, and how firms make decisions on what to produce and who to employ. Both macroeconomics and microeconomics often deal with international issues. Application areas in the Economics degree include such topics as health care, sports, tax policy, financial markets, labor markets, and international marketing and trade. Agricultural Economics and Management deals with economic issues related to food and fiber supply and demand, and with the natural resource base and environmental concerns surrounding agricultural production and other needs of society. Applications to public decision-making and private decisions of farms, ranches and agribusinesses are considered. Agribusiness deals more specifically with the business management activities of firms which process and merchandise products to consumers and which provide inputs such as fertilizer and capital/credit to production agriculture. In Agricultural Economics and Management, students learn to use economic concepts along with technical production information to solve problems of farms, ranches, and related organizations. They also obtain knowledge and skills relevant to solving broader economic and social problems concerning the allocation of individual, firm and natural/social resources. Bank loan officer, agricultural sales representative, and commodity broker are sample careers. Environmental and resource economics and management applies economic and management decision tools to issues in forest management, water use, pollution, land use, fisheries, recycling, and hazardous wastes. Professionals in this field learn to make decisions that balance the considerations of protecting, restoring, developing, and allocating natural resources for the most benefits to society.
